Qualifications: You can participate in this exciting experience when you:

1. are a currently registered adult Scouter, active in a Cub Scout Pack, Boy Scout Troop, Varsity Team, Venturing Crew, District or Council.
2. are at least 21 years of age (Assistant Scoutmasters may be 18).
3. have completed *New Leader Essentials & Position Specific Training* for your position. Note: *Outdoor Leader Skills* is required for Scoutmasters & Asst. Scoutmasters. All training prior to the year 2000 is an acceptable prerequisite.
4. submit an application with a \$50 deposit to reserve your place on course.
5. submit a completed **Class 3 physical** form, signed by a physician, within the course year .

Course Fee: The fee for the course is \$195, which may be paid in *installments*, with the remainder being paid no later than January 29, 2008. This fee covers all training materials and food for the duration of the course. You will need personal gear and uniforms.

Refunds: Fees will be refunded if you are unable to attend, provided you notify the council 30 days prior to the start of the course. **Space is limited.**

In the event the application is not accepted, all fees will be refunded. Candidates will be accepted on a *first-come-first-served* basis until the course reaches capacity. *Alternates* will be notified, and placed on a stand-by list.

Upon receipt of application, additional information will be sent.

Limited Scholarship funds are available by contacting the course director. Additional scholarships are available through the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the AFL-CIO. Contact your local chapter(s), or Council Program Services for applications.

Wood Badge is advanced training in leadership development. The **Wood Badge** program consists of two parts: **Practical training** and the **Application phase** – learning the material in six days on course, and practicing the leadership skills in your Scouting position over the next 18 months. **Wood Badge** training does **not** cover outdoor skills. The course draws from up-to-date leadership models used by corporate America, academic circles, and successful outdoor leadership organizations throughout the country. The course includes **team development modules, diversity training, and project management**. This combination of hands-on, direct experience, and application of leadership skills, is incredibly effective. **Wood Badge** has served as a source of training and inspiration to thousands of Scouters who, in turn, have affected the lives of millions of Scouting's youth. Participants also discover ways to not only use the leadership skills in their Scouting positions, but also to better their personal lives.

For six days you will live, learn, and work with other Scouters, while being exposed to the leadership skills applicable to the development of the scouting program. Through this **Wood Badge** experience, you will develop knowledge and practical understanding of these leadership skills. You will clarify what you want to accomplish in your Scouting position, and learn how to apply these skills to your Pack, Troop, Crew, Team, District, or Council.
